ST. JOSEPH'S KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL 6308

2018 Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity Charitable Contributions: The Parish's Knights of Columbus Council 6308 recently submitted its Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity for 2018 to the KC Supreme Office in Hartford, CT. For a small council with only 222 members, Council 6308 made a large contribution to the well-being of the parish and the community of Dickinson. Total disbursements to charitable organizations amounted to almost \$14,000 last year. This total amount included giving \$2000 to St. Joseph's Parish, \$4200 to community charities such as Hospice and Special Olympics and \$1650 to Right to Life. The Council's single largest amount of \$2500 was given to support Trinity Catholic Schools. Most of these funds were raised through the KC breakfasts that are held in the Pine Room after Mass, and the Council thanks all of the parish patrons who attend. Without your support, the Council could not make these charitable donations. To compliment its charitable donations, Council members tallied 2500 hours of service given to the parish and the Dickinson community at large. Over 2000 people, many of them parishioners, benefited from these hours of service. Council members serve the parish as ushers, readers, deacons, choir members and often help with the maintenance and repair of the parish facilities. Plus, parish Knights are involved in community activities such as the Amen Food Pantry, The American Legion Honor Guard and Special Olympics. The Knights of Columbus are devoted to the betterment of Church and community, and our parish Council service hours exemplifies this dedication.
